




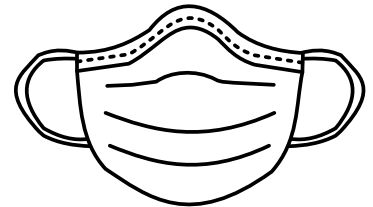


August 25 **Third Party Candidates in US History**
